A HISTORICAL OVERVIEW OF TRANSLATION-ORIENTED TERMINOLOGY IN THE CANADIAN TERMINOLOGY OF SCIENCE

Abstract: The paper deals with the origins of translation-oriented terminology in Canada and the role it plays in the Canadian terminology of science.
