ACROLECT AND HYPERLECT: REVISITING ENGLISH RP

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Abstract: Determining the accent that we use is a notoriously vexing problem for a number of reasons. This paper focuses on one of the most well-known accents in England, Received Pronunciation. Among the complicating factors which invite us to re-examine the concept of RP are the uses to which it is put, taking into consideration the fact that British English is a language learned by an increasing number of foreign speakers, the evolution of language itself and of society, as well as the Americanization in grammar but also in pronunciation.
